The First Reading 2 Peter 3:8-15a

But do not overlook this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day. ⁹ The Lord is not slow to fulfill his promise as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance. ¹⁰ But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a roar, and the heavenly bodies will be burned up and dissolved, and the earth and the works that are done on it will be exposed. ¹¹ Since all these things are thus to be dissolved, what sort of people ought you to be in lives of holiness and godliness, ¹² waiting for and hastening the coming of the day of God, because of which the heavens will be set on fire and dissolved, and the heavenly bodies will melt as they burn! ¹³ But according to his promise we are waiting for new heavens and a new earth in which righteousness dwells. ¹⁴ Therefore, beloved, since you are waiting for these, be diligent to be found by him without spot or blemish, and at peace. ¹⁵ And count the patience of our Lord as salvation, just as our beloved brother Paul also wrote to you according to the wisdom given him.

Prayer of Consecration (the people may kneel)

In obedience to your will, he stretched out his arms upon the Cross and offered himself once for all, that by his suffering and death we might be saved. By his resurrection he broke the bonds of death, trampling Hell and Satan under his feet. As our great high priest, he ascended to your right hand in glory, that we might come with confidence before the throne of grace. On the night that he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat; this is my Body, which is given for you: Do this in remembrance of me." Likewise, after supper, Jesus took the cup, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink this, all of you; for this is my Blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for you, and for many, for the forgiveness of sins: Whenever you drink it, do this in remembrance of me." Therefore, we proclaim the mystery of faith:

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, and we offer you these gifts. Sanctify them by your Word and Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son Jesus Christ. Sanctify (+) us also, that we may worthily receive this holy Sacrament, and be made one body with him, that he may dwell in us and we in him. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us with all your saints into the joy of your heavenly kingdom, where we shall see our Lord face to face. All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and forever. *Amen*.

Celebrant: Let us pray.



The BreadBasket

A Non-Profit Organization Dedicated to Feeding the Needy

In 1989, Fr. Craig saw the need to feed lunch to hungry people in Lee County, no questions asked. With tremendous help from Elisabeth Wilkinson, Betsy Parnell and others from St. Thomas, The BreadBasket opened its doors in September 1990, serving lunches of soup and sandwiches. Over the years, meals evolved to include a home-cooked meal of meat, two vegetables, salad, tea and dessert. In 2002, as demand grew, we built an 1,800-square-foot building with an industrial kitchen at our current location, **140 East Chisholm Street**.

The Breadbasket operations are run by Susan Rosenthal who, pre-Covid, oversaw 300+ volunteers who prepared and served meals for the clients at the facility, picked up food donations from generous grocery stores and restaurants around town, and sorted and stored incoming food at The BreadBasket.

Now, demand is greater than ever. We are serving 1,000-1,200 take-out meals per week, a pace of nearly 60,000 meals per year. However, many of our original volunteers are retirees who do not feel safe returning to service at The BreadBasket, so those who have continued to volunteer are working far more hours than before and are exhausted.

St. Francis would like to put together a team of volunteers. Young people are welcome to serve as well. If you would be willing to help once a month (or more often), please contact Fr. Matt (757.345.1299) or Tom Reese (919.478.1955)
